





garten, giving youngsters a great start. Our public library offers an amazing number of volumes and services, and is responsive to the needs of the community.





Moundridge Then And Now

OUR HISTORY

hile the Plains Indians had made occasional stops in what eventually became Mound Township, homesteaders started flowing into the area in the early 1860s, acquiring land for agricultural purposes.

James W. Edwards, the first settler in Mound Township, said in an interview many years later that the county commissioners asked him to suggest a name for the township. He chose "Mound" because of the mound in the terrain one mile west of Moundridge, the highest point between Newton McPherson.

In 1874 there was a migration to the area of Mennonites from Russia, Germany and Switzerland who took advantage of the railroad's offer to give land to people who would develop and live on the land adjacent to the railroad.

The Missouri Pacific Railroad extended its line between Newton and McPherson in 1886. Four area residents - Thornton Cole, Christian Krehbiel, John Wedel and Jacob Wedel - each donated their adjoining 40-acre tracts to the organizers of the Mound Town Company in 1886. The area was platted into the Town Site of Moundridge.

The town of Christian was located one mile south of the railroad line. Christian ended up literally moving to Moundridge.

On July 5, 1887, the Board of County Commissioners incorporated Moundridge as a third class city with a population of 400.

MOUNDRIDGE TODAY

Moundridge has grown into a thriving third class city with a population of 1,737 residents, according to the 2010 U.S.

Census.

The municipal government consists of an appointed city administrator, five elected city council members and an elected mayor. The council members and mayor all serve four-year terms.

The council holds a monthly meeting to perform the duties of the governing body.

Moundridge is a member of the League of Kansas Municipalities, which gives city officials access to the latest governmental issues in the state.

The city owns the utilities electricity, natural gas and water. Residents are able to enjoy rates that are competitive with - if not among the lowest when compared to services in neighboring towns.

Moundridge has its own police and fire departments, as well as Emergency Medical Services.

The city encourages residents to recycle. The city's recycling center is located on east Cole Street across the street from Moundridge High School.

Residents can bring newspa-

pers, magazines, cardboard, glass containers, aluminum, tin cans and certain plastics - PET 1 and HDPE 2 plastic only - to be recycled.

The center is open from 3-6 p.m. every Monday and Wednesday and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. every Saturday.

There is a city burn site for residents to take all of their yard debris. The site is located 2.5 miles south of town on 22nd Avenue on the west side of the road. Raw wood - no paint or nails - may be disposed of at the site.

The burn site is open from 12:30 to 5:30 p.m., Mondays and Wednesdays, and from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Saturdays.

The municipal airport features a 3,400-foot hard surfaced runway and a 1,650-foot surfaced taxiway. Fuel is available 24 hours a day.

Rollforming Corp. in Moundridge, Kan.; Marion Die & Fixture in Marion, Kan.; Beck Automation, LLC in St. Louis, Mo.; Alliance Machine and Engraving, LLC in Ashland, Va.; Hayes International in New Zealand; Bradbury U.K. in the United Kingdom; Bradbury Machinery (Shanghai) Co. Ltd. in China; Bradbury Group Australia; Metform International Ltd. in Canada; and Athader S.L. in Spain. To extend its international reach, Group sales offices include Bradbury Russia, Bradbury India, and Bradbury Mexico as well as agents worldwide.

CRC has 20 employees.

A family-owned business that manufactures the international known Grasshopper zero turn, commercial grade, grounds maintenance equipment.

Moridge Manufacturing has been in business since 1958. The Moundridge facility has between 230 to 250 employees.

Engineers continuously research and test new product features and improvements at the company 300,000-square-foot facility.

The company's skilled manufacturing specialists use the latest high-tech equipment, including computer-aided manufacturing fully integrated with a 3-D solid modeling computer design system, CNC fabrication and machining.

The business received the 2012 Pollution Prevention Award from the State of Kansas for investing in clean and efficient technology.

Grasshopper products are sold in more than 36 countries worldwide.

Weaver Aero International

In business since 1987, Weaver Aero International has an exceptional level of experience in aircraft sales - domestic and international. Weaver can represent either buyers or sellers of aircraft.

Weaver has disassembled, packaged and shipped aircraft worldwide. They have worked in many countries, including Australia, China, Columbia, Egypt, Germany, India, Japan, New Zealand, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, and United Arab Emirates. They can ship new and used aircraft. Usually, they work with single-engine aircraft, and they can do twinengine models as well.



Moundridge Food Market


The deli offers customers breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

City Offers Incentive To Build A Home

ommunity leaders in Moundridge would like to see the city grow. They want to give others an opportunity to share in the Moundridge experience.

In fact, city leaders have decided to put some of the city's money where their mouths are. City leaders have enacted a grant program, which they believe to be unprecedented in the state.

The City of Moundridge will grant \$6,000 to any person completing a new residence on any vacant lot in the city prior to Aug. 1, 2014.

City officials noted that if anyone builds a \$120,000 home, the grant is equal to 5 percent of the purchase price.

The biggest concentration of growth has been occurring north of town off of Christian Avenue and south of Interstate 135. The Wollmann Addition is located west of Christian, while the Ridgewood Addition is on the east side

There are several local options available in finding a company to construct a new home.

One possibility is Koehn Construction. Koehn builds both modular and stick built homes. With their modular homes, Koehn will build the home at their Moundridge site and then move it to your location. Koehn's modular homes are also eligible for the city's grant.



any of the medical needs of Moundridge residents can be handled within the community. There is a general acute care hospital in town, along with a family practice medical clinic. We also have chiropractic care, physical therapy, dental clinic, and massage therapy services in town. Moundridge also has an alcohol and drug abuse treatment center.

Mercy Hospital
Our 21-bed hospital provides for general medical needs, including obstetrics. Mercy has an emergency room, and has operating rooms. There are outpatient physical therapy services available.

The non-profit hospital was established in 1944, and is affiliated with the Church of God in Christ, Mennonite.

The six family practice physicians associated with Partners in Family Care are on staff with the hospital

Partners in Family Care

Located next door to the hospital is the medical clinic.

Partners in Family Care has six

family medicine doctors and three physician's assistants serving in three location - Moundridge, Inman and Hesston. The doctors all received training in pediatrics, obstetrics, adult and child emergency, internal medicine, surgery, occupational health and trauma. All physicians are board certified in family medicine.

The clinic provides computerized state-of-the-art care for patients, and offers laboratory, and ACR-accredited CT and nuclear medicine services.

Specialists in orthopedics and cardiology are available for consultations at the Moundridge office. Two counselors have office hours at the clinic.

The clinic participates as an intern training site through the University of Kansas School of Medicine.

Moundridge Pharmacy

Housed in he same building as the medical clinic, four pharmacists serve in the business.

It is located in a convenient place for patients needing to fill a prescription.

Emergency Medical Service

The ambulance service, located across the street from the clinic, is manned by 20 emergency medical technicians and others certified in first aid and CPR. Moundridge has two fully equipped ambulances.

Porter Chiropractic Clinic

Dr. Lee Porter provides advanced spinal correction utilizing state of the art chiropractic techniques. He uses a "whole person approach" when treating a patient, looking for underlying causes of any disturbances or disruption and make whatever interventions and lifestyle adjustments that would optimize the conditions for normal function.

There is a massage therapist on staff to assist patients.

PathFinders Physical Therapy

An outpatient physical therapy clinic owned by physical therapist Cindy Bartell. The clinic provides therapy for neurological or orthopedic conditions, women's health issues, lymphedema, pediatrics, elderly issues, sports issues and workplace injuries. The staff works with local school districts, home health agencies and local care facilities.

Valley Hope

The Valley Hope Drug Rehab Center is a state licensed 50-bed facility that includes residential inpatient, day or partial care, medically monitored alcohol detox, family program and relapse prevention/continuing care. Staff also provides assessment/evaluation services.

The Moundridge facility has Joint Commission on Accreditation Organizations (JCAHO) accreditation.

Moundridge Dental Clinic

Opened Wednesdays and Thursdays, the clinic provides a variety of dental services. The clinic offers its services to both children and adults.

Main Street Massage and A Therapeutic Touch also assist people with massage therapy services.

any retired residents of Moundridge find food, fellowship and fun at the local senior center, located at 100 N. Schmidt. The center's activities are geared toward residents age 60 and older.

Nutritious Friendship Meals are served Monday through Friday at the center. Meals can also be delivered to the seniors at their home.

One day each month, seniors' birthdays, as well as anniversaries for couples, are celebrat-

ed during Friendship Meal time. The celebrations include special entertainment.

The center promotes fellowship and fun through its many activities, including quilting, billiards, card games and puzzles, and field trips. The center arranges field trips, which are well attended, to interesting locations.

Once a month, the center brings in a registered nurse to provide foot care and check blood pressures for local seniors.

The center offers an exercise class for seniors

three days a week.

If they meet certain guidelines, seniors can qualify to receive monthly federal government commodities at the center.

Public transportation is available through the center, which has a 10-passenger van. It can be used for doctor visits or shopping trips. There is a fee for out-of-town trips. Seniors should contact the senior center at 620-345-2729 for more information.

Situated on a 40-acre campus, Pine Village - formerly known as Memorial Home - is located just south of town.

There is a wellness center on campus that includes a weight and exercise room, wheelchair accessible heated indoor pool, hot tub and banquet area.

Northridge Manor

Located on the north end of Moundridge, Northridge Manor includes a number of duplex units.

Moundridge Manor

Also on the north end of town on Christian Avenue, Moundridge Manor is a licensed adult care home under the administration of 13 area congregations with Church of God in Christ, Mennonite.

Built in 1976, the Manor currently has 77 beds.

An expansion project has started at the Manor. When completed in 2014, the facility will have a new kitchen and dining room. The new edition will include 26 private rooms for residents. The facility will end up with 65 private rooms and six semi-private rooms for couples.

Sunrise Manor is an independent living facility located next to the Manor. Sunrise has a total of eight apartments.



The schools boast test scores among the best in Kansas, numerous state championships in multiple activities, and award-winning art and music programs. 400 students. Most of the district classrooms are equipped with instructional technology including Promethean interactive boards and iPads as learning tools. 

Our city parks offer many amenities for families or individuals to enjoy.

Moundridge features three municipal parks.

Black Kettle Park offers two shelter houses. The East Park has a covered area for extra tables. You can cross a

covered bridge to get to the West Park. Both shelter houses have refrigerators you can use, as well as electrical outlets. Arrangements need to be made with the City Office to use the Shelter Houses.

There is playground equipment located throughout the park, along with a basketball court on the north end. Black Kettle has a pond, which

features a waterfall.

Wheatridge Park is located close to the municipal swimming pool. The 25meter pool features two spring boards, a water slide and a smaller wading pool for younger children. Lifeguards are on duty during pool hours.

Wheatridge has a sledding hill for when it snows. There are two tennis courts. Located between the tennis courts and swimming pool is a skateboard park. It has a half-pipe and a rail. Residents are able to enjoy a 9hole frisbee golf course.

Pack Park, located next to the Wollmann Addition on the north end of town, includes a beautiful stocked fishing pond. There are a couple of docks for fishermen to use.

There is a measured hiking path, and playground equipment. There is an air conditioned shelter house and equipped kitchen facility. Contact the City Office to use the shelter house.

Moundridge Recreation Commission offers many athletic activities for children and adults. The MRC handles the swimming pool, two public ball diamonds and Greer Gymnasium.

In the fall, MRC activities include youth soccer and adult coed softball. MRC has youth basketball and volleyball teams during the winter.

During summer months, MRC offers youth softball and baseball teams. There are Babe Ruth baseball teams for teen boys. At the pool, MRC has swim lessons and parties, as well as late night swims.

In June, younger children can participate in a T-ball clinic. There are also basketball and volleyball clinics for older children

The Cole House Museum is an historic house, which started as the first house in Moundridge in 1875. The family made many additions to it, eventually giving it 15 rooms. The Cole family donated many of the original furnishings, photographs and artifacts, giving visitors a glimpse of how people lived in this area during the late 1800s.

The Depot Museum began as an actual railroad depot in the 1880s when the railroad came through the area. The depot is located on Cole Street, away from the other museums. Artifacts and photographs are available to help the visitor understand the significance of the railroad to the development of our city.

The Agricultural Museum is located on the Cole House grounds. Antique farm equipment and tools are exhibited, showing people the important role agricultural has played in our history.

Next to the Agricultural Museum is one of the newest additions to the complex. A working blacksmith shop has been constructed. When open, visitors can see how old-time blacksmiths worked their trade.

The latest museum in the complex is the Heritage Museum. From the outside, it looks like a red barn. It features exhibits showing the histories of area churches, items that were used in the home, equipment that was used in the medical field, old school athletic uniforms and cheerleader outfits, military uniforms worn by local men, and artifacts from local businesses, including a soda fountain bar from a drug store and old copies of The Ledger newspa-

The Moundridge Public Library is a shining gem for our community. Programs to attract residents of all ages occur year round. Books, magazines and DVD rentals are available. The library offers a couple of computers with on-line access for visitors to use.

The library is part of Sunflower eLibrary. Patrons can go to a virtual library to checkout and return books. There are eBooks that can be downloaded to your eReader device.



Residents are encouraged to decorate their yards with lights and compete for Chamber Bucks.


